We are so excited to be organizing our first Waimak Riding Club camp. Planning is coming together nicely, so what should you expect? In keeping with our club ethos, it will be a weekend of learning, building friendships, and a good dose of fun.

Friday you will arrive from 4pm, settle your horse into its yard or stable or small paddock, share a potluck dinner, and spend the evening getting you and your horse familiar with the setting, ridden or inhand. Saturday and Sunday you can start the day with an invigorating fitness session tailored for the equestrian. Then the day is filled with a lesson each (similar to club rallies), and opportunities *to* learn from demostrations. Topics like massaging your horse, working your horse inhand, float maintenance, and watching other people's lessons. Lunch and dinner are provided.

Saturday evening we also invite other club members or spouses along (\$30 each) for a bbq dinner, music entertainment and line dancing.

Camp will finish at 4pm Sunday, by which time you will be inspired and equipped to continue developing your riding further, and have deepened some friendships.

Camp spaces are limited to 30 riders with one horse each, and will cost \$200. If you don't currently have a horse to bring but want to come along to watch during the day we can work something out. let's talk.

Finances

Here's a summary of what's been achieved so far:

- Xero: Subscription upgraded successfully and added to the budget. I have also removed the 20+ something
 users who had access. Sue still has read only access in case I need to call on her!
- Reregistration: This is now complete! Woohoo we are compliant.
- Tax: I am working through the processes. I have applied to become Income Tax Exempt. I will then apply for a RWT Tax exemption and if possible, see if we can apply to be refunded previous RWT payments through BNZ.
- Budgets: A work in progress! But I have attached what I have managed so far.
- Events & Structure: Gwen and I have been working together to help me understand how things operate and
 are structured including the financial side of the club which is in turn helping me to understand better how
 the budgets are working and what everyone's roles are.

SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL STATUS

- 1. The opening balance for the Club on 18^{th} July 2025 is \$5981.61 + \$509.55 + \$7931.85 = $\frac{$14423.01}{2}$ = BNZ accounts 00, 01 and 02.
- 2. Total income for the year so far is $$9,600.85 + $1,176.28 = \frac{$10,777.13}{}$ (i.e. Trading Income + Other Income).
- 3. Total expenditure for the year so far is $$5,800.91 + $2,239.60 = \frac{$8040.51}{}$ (i.e. Cost of Sales + Operating Expenses).
