## South Island Teams Event 2025 SITE

How many of you know about the South Island Teams Event? SITE? Well do you know that Riding Clubs from across the South Island, from Nelson to Foveau Straight used to meet annually to compete in a number of fun events like pair dressage, CTR ride, Riding club mount, show jumping, arena cross and so on? For two days? There is a trophy somewhere - believed to be won last by the standardbred association!

A number of reasons including covid and some dispersal of key staff mean this event is currently only in the North Island. As a result of my natural curiousity about stuff, chance meetings with people who used to run these events and some previous contacts have meant I have held a preliminary meeting with four other clubs (Wakefield and Districts, Blenheim and districts, Canterbury Advocacy) and we have a secretary, Rosemary Lee-Oldfield, a treasurer, Robyn Moylan (both from Wakefield) who have run it before. We have agreed the following principles.

- Be held in this first year in Canterbury.
- Up to 10 teams accepted with 4-6 riders in teams
- Composite teams accepted...
- Two days Labour weekend 2025

## **Committee Finances**

We still have to hear from the Rata Foundation application I made to support coaching. There is often a dilemma with spending and relative proportions of spend in which direction. Do we want facilities and things or to spend on members?

Our general direction has been to spend on members, supporting coaching and do some of the leg work ourselves. My own thinking is this approach, at this time supports developing a sense of community and engagement! Keeps us fit! We have also been very busy getting the Team Dressage Quest underway and now Ribbon Day so thinking about other things has had to wait.

Your committee continues to support coaching which varies depending on the coach and facilities used. Club subsidies for rallies to date are \$657.00 In due course, we may look at other options but the benefits for us and our horses are more than we might imagine.
